Cross-Country

The Cheetahs continue to burn up the course at the West Valley League cross-country meets. At the Rolling Hills meet, the 8th-grade girls team took 2nd place with 40 points, just behind Fisher. The team was led by Erika Rohloff, Aiden McGuire, Kylie Horn, Bella DeMeo, Jasmine Watson, and Naia Wilcox. The 5/6th grade boys also took 2nd place, with 97 points. The squad was led by Corbin Lane, Kurt Beckmann, Matthew Fehr, Ethan Jeffrey, Jake Leonhart, Eli Stephens, and Daniel Phillips. Other top CTE performances at this meet were Mike Ramsay, who finished in 6th place in the 7th-grade race; Jack Engel who was in 17th-place in the 8th-grade boys race; and Lizzie Kinsella, who was 20th in the 7th-grade girls race.



In the next meet, the 5/6th-grade CTE boys swept their division at the JD Morgan park course, the team finishing with only 46 points, quite a lead over second-place, Ida Price's 82 points. Alec Reiss was the winner, followed by Corbin Lane, Kurt Beckmann, Matthew Fehr, Ethan Jeffrey, Harris Campbell, and Daniel Phillips. The 8th-grade girls were very close to beating Fisher this time, placing 2nd with 34 points, just 6 points behind the winning Fisher squad. The team was led by Aiden McGuire, Erika Rohloff, Lindsay Templeton, Bella DeMeo, Kylie Horn, Jasmine Watson, and Naia Wilcox.

Other top individual performances at the meet included 7th-grader Mike Ramsay finishing in the 8th spot; three 7th-grade girls finishing in the top 20: Amanda Simmons (16th), Crystal (19th), Lizzie Kinsella (20th); and in the 8th-grade boys race, Jack Engel was 16th and Trevor Beauchamp was the 19th to cross the finish line.
